The goal of the Children's Mental Health Project is to decrease youth involvement in gang activity, violence, and drug and alcohol abuse, and to address mental health/addictions issues that are often a result of high incidences of family violence.

The program serves children and youth between 7 and 15 years of age. The program uses a "culturally based approach" to strengthen the family unit.

Services include:

- Family support
- Therapeutic group services such as children's circles, healing circles, Kiizhaay Anishinabe Niin and Kanawayhitowin
- Public education on drug and alcohol abuse, violence and gang activity
- Community and cultural events
- Intake and assessments
- Referrals to appropriate needs of family and children
- Peer counselling to assist with coping strategies

Kenora-Rainy River Districts Child and Family Services is an integrated agency whose programs and services include Children's Mental Health Services.

Services include:

- Individual counselling
- Family counselling
- Group counselling
- Psychometric assessments
- Development of treatment plans
- Suicide risk support services available 24 hours a day
- Linkages with health, financial, and educational services in the community
- Support and assistance with behavioural problems
- The Arson Prevention Program for Children (TAPP-C)
- Assistance with concerns related to anger management, attachment, bullying, communication skills, family functioning, loss/separation/divorce, relationships, sexual abuse victimization, and social skills

Riverside Community Counselling provides Community Treatment Services to people in the community, 18 years and older, who are experiencing addiction, mental health and trauma problems. Services are provided to individuals, couples, families, and groups.

Services include:

- Addiction assessment/referral only—any age
- Addiction counselling and relapse prevention—ages 18 years+ only
- Problem gambling—any age
- Family violence of unresolved child, intimate partner (dating) and sexual assault—adult women who have been victims/survivors, and men of any age who have been survivors of sexual assault
- Mental health support for those experiencing loss, mental illness, emotional crisis, traumatic childhood, disability, LGBTQ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender), or other life issues
- Eating disorders—any age
- Marital and family counselling for family relationships and conflict, communication skills, separation and divorce

Additional programs:

- Awareness and educational sessions on addiction, mental health, and trauma issues are negotiable due to limited resources.
- Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) services may be limited due to scope of event; contact 1-866-888-8988 anytime or from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. contact 274-4807 for response.
